Dear Friends and Music Lovers,

Welcome to the 29th season of **Music in the Vineyards**! We have a great festival planned, which will take place over four weekends instead of our usual three. This allows us the opportunity to add special events such as our **Not-So-Silent Cinema** and our first-ever **Concert for the Community** in addition to our regular festival concerts. Also notable are two illuminating talks by familiar faces, one about Stravinsky and the other about Schubert on subsequent Thursday nights.
